Discussion Questions

- At the beginning of the film Mike makes a difficult decision involving an elderly person. Is his decision to be Leo's guardian legal or ethical? What is the difference?
- In what ways does Mike's misstep come back to haunt him in the film? Is he able to be truthful with his wife and friends as a result?
- Mike's friend Terry provides much of the comic relief in the film. How do the filmmakers balance the serious discussions about Mike's financial situation with one-liners that Terry utters from time to time? Do these help make the film better rounded and
- The actor who plays Kyle had never before appeared in a film. Can you tell from his acting or his wrestling skills?
 How does he compare with the more experienced actors in the movie?
- Issues of control arise frequently in the film, as Mike struggles to control his financial situation, Terry struggles to control his failing marriage, and Kyle feels like he is in control in the wrestling ring. How do the filmmakers work through this theme, and what conclusions can you draw about how we all want to control our own lives? Are there times you feel like everything is completely out of control?
